Early years | Ambitious about Autism

Autism can be identified within the first 3 years of life, in some cases within the first two years. We know that autism is present from birth, but it is very difficult to identify early on because many of the signs are also present in children who do not have autism. Some researchers look at the developmental trajectories to try and predict what will eventually be conclusively identified as autism.
