The primary contribution of Hwansoo Ilmee Kim's research is to both problematize and attempt to correct the oversimplified tripartite approach of analyzing the participants in and proponents of Korean Buddhism in this pivotal epoch of early modern Korean history.

More broadly, the cases explored in the The Korean Buddhist Empire reveal that, while Japanese Buddhism exerted the most influence, Korean Buddhism was (as Japanese Buddhism was itself) deeply influenced by developments in China, Taiwan, Sri Lanka, Europe, and the United States, as well as by Christianity.
