Emergency management of poisoning or overdose. If the person has collapsed and is unresponsive ensure the airway is open (in the absence of trauma) and check for normal breathing. If they are unresponsive and not breathing normally, start cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) immediately, and call for an ambulance.

Management of Poisoning and Drug Overdose in Adult...

Management of poisoning involves the assessment and treatment of airway compromise, ventilation impairment and haemodynamic instability. Thereafter, temperature disturbances should be treated, convulsions controlled, fluid, acid–base and electrolyte abnormalities corrected, and complications such as methaemoglobinaemia, rhabdomyolysis and serotonin syndrome diagnosed and managed optimally.

MANAGEMENT OF POISONING AND DRUG OVERDOSE

Management of SSRI poisoning is supportive. Activated charcoal given within 1 hour of the overdose reduces absorpction of the drug. Convulsions can be treated with lorazepam, diazepam, or midazolam oromucosal solution [unlicensed use in adults and children under 3 months] (see Convulsions).

Recognition and Management of Acute Medication Poisoning...

For management of ventricular tachycardias, agents that prolong QT interval like Class Ia, Class Ic, and Class III antiarrhythmic drugs are contraindicated as these may predispose to torsades de pointes [3] (although amiodarone is an exception in Class II drugs). Use lidocaine, 1–3 mg/kg IV or amiodarone 300 mg IV or 5 mg/kg in children.

NAI or neglect should be considered particularly where accidental poisoning is not consistent with the developmental age of the child, the history is inconsistent, there is a past history of poisoning, illicit drugs or unusual poisoning from household substances. Infants under 1 do not self-administer medicines.

Management Activated carbon is a commonly used agent for decontamination of the gastrointestinal tract in overdoses. Stabilization of the victim’s airway, breathing, and circulation (ABCs) is the initial treatment of an overdose. Ventilation is considered when there is a low respiratory rate or when blood gases show the person to be hypoxic.
