Important coronavirus updates for ophthalmologists ...

An excessive amount of light scattering and yellowing is called a nuclear cataract, which causes a central opacity (Fig 5-2). The ophthalmologist can evaluate the degree of increased color and of opacification by using a slit-lamp biomicroscope and by examining the red reflex with the pupil dilated. Nuclear cataracts tend to progress slowly.

Following Cataract Surgery - Post-operative Eye Care And ...

1. There's more than one type of cataract formation. The most common type of cataract (found in people over age 40) forms mainly in the center of your eye's lens. This called a nuclear cataract. Another type of cataract is called a cortical cataract. This wedge-shaped cataract develops at the edge of the lens instead of the center.

Commissioning Guide: Adult Cataract Surgery

Cataracts are diagnosed through a simple eye exam that includes dilation (your pupils are widened with the help of eye drops) so that your eye doctor can thoroughly examine your eyes, looking for abnormalities in your cornea, iris, lens, and other areas at the front of your eyes; and specific signs of cataract at the back of your eyes.

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
