Practice development uses research and theory in a way that is sensitive to practice issues on the ground. This helps practitioners to engage with the evidence base. A project set up in Newcastle to implement recommendations on laxative prescribing for older people illustrates this.

The Professional Capabilities Framework (PCF) says that social workers should “make use of research to inform practice” and the Knowledge and Skills Statement for child and family practitioners says they should “make use of the best evidence from research to... support families and protect children”.

Research in developmental neuroscience has demonstrated that children grow cognitively at different rates and may not achieve the same stage at the same time. Because children's capabilities develop over time, a teacher needs to understand what is developing and tailor the instruction to the learner.
